Ministry	Description
Adoration	Adoration of the Holy Eucharist and Benediction is an opportunity for you to be alone with God and deepen your relationship through this gaze and contemplation on Jesus in the Most Holy Sacrament of the Eucharist. It is also a time to place before our Lord your petitions as well those of others.
Advent Fair	Each year on the first Sunday of Advent, all parish families are invited to gather for a simple lunch of soup and treats. Supplies are made available (and some for sale too) to make your very own Advent Wreath. There are also activities for the children.
Alpha Course	Alpha provides an opportunity to meet others and chat about some of life's big questions in an open and friendly environment and explore Christianity. Alpha is for anyone and everyone. Weekly sessions typically include: a meal, an intriguing talk (often on video, but not always), and small group discussion. People enjoy great food, laughter and learning in a fun and non-threatening atmosphere where no question about life or God is seen as too simple or too hostile questions like: Is there a God? Why am I here? Where am I going? Meetings: Sunday evenings at 6:00PM.
Altar Linens	The clothes used at the altar in the course of the Eucharistic celebration are treated with the care and respect due those things used in the preparation and celebration of the sacred mysteries. Proper cleaning methods are used to preserve the beauty and life of the altar cloths and it is appropriate to accompany care of the linens with prayer.
Altar Servers	Altar Servers assist the presider on weekdays, Sundays, Holy Days of Obligation and other liturgical celebrations. Children from grade 3 through 8 are eligible to serve and must have received First Holy Communion. Training is provided.
Art and Environment	Church Decor - Design and prepare the church environment for weekend Masses and liturgical seasons, including special candles and banners.  Church Flowers - Provide and arrange floral decorations for all weekend Masses, Easter and Christmas. Donations of flowers are always welcome. Meetings: Saturday mornings at 8:00AM in the Church.  Votive and Altar Candles - Maintain the votive candles in the chapel and all altar candles.
Bible Study	Attending Bible study classes is a positive way to share, learn about and implement the Scripture into your every day life. Past studies include Catholicism, The Book of Joshua, Seven Deadly Sins/Seven Lively Virtues, and the Gospel of John. English: Wednesday evening (6:15 - 8:00PM), Thursday morning (9:00 - 10:45AM) or Sunday evening (6:30 - 8:15PM) during the school year. Spanish: Wednesday evening, 6:15PM - 8:00PM
Boy Scouts	Troop 140 is a "boy-led" organization with Scouts in all positions of leadership. By voting, they select the activities they want to enjoy each year. Boys range in age from 11 to 18 years. Adults work in the background providing guidance, act as Merit Badge Counselors, chair fundraising activities and provide transportation. Activities include camping trips, participation in BSA Council activities and service projects and other activities. Meetings: Normally held each Monday evening in the Parish Center at 7: 00PM. Meetings usually run 1-1/2 hours. Website: www.troop140.com
Bulletin Inserts	The bulletin is a wonderful resource to let our parishioners and guests know about what is going on in our parish week by week. To include parish or parish ministry-related information in the weekly bulletin, contact the parish office. The deadline for inserts is Friday noon. Volunteers insert these informational inserts in the bulletin weekly. Please support our bulletin advertisers. Because of their generosity, there is no cost to our parish to print the weekly bulletins.
Catholic Daughters	Catholic Daughters is a national charitable organization for Catholic women over the age of 18. Programs cover a vast scope of activities including engaging in fund-raising projects such as the annual tea, rummage sale, craft/bake sale and baby shower.

Ministry	Description
Catholic Youth Organization (CYO)	CYO at SJA is dedicated to developing the athlete through sports and instilling in them sportsmanship. Check the CYO website for information regarding specific sports programs. This program is run strictly by volunteers. There are plenty of opportunities for providing commitment hours. Volunteer needs include coaching (all sports), gym monitor (basketball and volleyball), scorekeeper (basketball and volleyball), line judge (volleyball) and field judge (track). Children's Liturgy of the Word	Children are invited to leave the Sunday 10:30AM Mass during the Liturgy of the Word and gather elsewhere to listen to the Scriptures and discuss its meaning at their level of understanding. We offer CLOW for children in pre-school through 3rd grade. Adult leaders are encouraged to assist at least once a month to make this ministry happen. This ministry is also listed under Faith Formation. When: October through May
Christmas Giving Tree	Every Christmas there are families in need and here at SJA we do our best to help where and when we can. We have a giving tree in the back of the Church with tags on it for specific gifts. Parishioners take the tags and then return them with the gifts. A team of dedicated people wrap all the gifts and then get the opportunity to deliver them to the selected families before Christmas. It is a wonderful way to serve during the Chrismas Season.
Church Cleaning	Responsibilities of this ministry include vacuuming and dusting the Church, statues, and the museum monthly, washing the pews once a year and spot cleaning the carpet as needed. <b>Meetings:</b> Every 2nd Tuesday at 9:00AM
Couples Connection	SJA couples meet in a different home each month to socialize and support each other spiritually. Couples also support various projects throughout the community.
Cub Scouts	Pack 140 is an adult-led unit providing a year round family program designed for boys who are in first through fifth grades, or 6 - 11 years of age. Activities emphasize family participation and cultivate a love and appreciation of the outdoors. Adult volunteer leaders include Den (small group) Leaders who work directly with the scouts and Pack Committee Members who manage the Pack. Meetings: First 3 Fridays of each month at 7:00PM in the Parish Center.
Divine Mercy/Our Lady of Fatima Prayer Group	Through home visits, this prayer group encourages others to pray the Rosary and the Chaplet of the Divine Mercy, and brings Catechism and the Sacraments to families being visited. It encourages families to come back to the Church and brings and shares the Gospel. A visit by the Image of Our Lady of Fatima to parishioners' homes brings her more intimately into our homes, our hearts and our lives.
Extraordinary Eucharistic Ministers	Assist the priest in distributiuon of the Body and Blood of Christ to fellow worshippers who so desire at Saturday evening and Sunday morning Masses, as well as Holy Days of Obligation. Ministers are scheduled for monthly or weekly assignments.
Family Unity Night Dinners	Our FUN Dinners happens Wednesday nights before Religious Education and Youth Group. All parishioners are welcome to attend a free dinner (donations always welcome). Dinner goes from 5:40PM to 6:10PM. This ministry is served by volunteer parishioners and other ministries.
Feed Our Pastor (Meal Train)	In 2015, our parish began providing a dinner every Thursday for our pastor. Meals are delivered to the Parish office between 12 Noon and 4:30PM. Scheduling is handled with an online program called Meal Train (www.mealtrain.com/ngn7ve). This website contains information on our pastor's favorite foods and any food allergies.
FORMED	FORMED is the revolutionary digital platform that gives your parish unprecedented access to video-based study programs, feature films, audio presentations, and eBooks from the Church's foremost presenters. Whether fallen away or deeply engaged, at the parish or on the go, FORMED helps you reach your flock anytime, anywhere.
Funeral Receptions	The Funeral Reception Ministry is available to provide a luncheon for the family after the funeral service. The meal is usually held in the Parish Center, but it can be held in a nice facility at the cemetery for smaller groups. Volunteers are needed to set up, serve, clean up, and provide hospitality and comfort food for the reception.

Ministry	Description
Girl Scouts	Girl Scouts is open to girls in Kindergarten - 12th grade. Girl scouts can earn badges and awards (My Promise, My Faith), or plan other activities based on the age and interests of the group (service, camping, etc.). Volunteers are provided training and can work with a particular troop throughout the year or at a special event. Meetings: Times and locations vary depending on the needs of the individual group. In-Home Pastoral Care	Extraordinary Ministers (EM) of Holy Communion are the face of Christ and represent the Church and the parish to those sick parishioners who are in need of in-home pastoral care. They bring Jesus in the most holy sacrament of the Eucharistic table on Sunday. EM's not only provide Holy Communion and share the Word of God, but they bring compassion as well, offering support and a listening ear.
Knights of Columbus	Knights of Columbus members are Catholic men committed to the exemplification of charity, unity, fraternity, patriotism, and defense of the priesthood. The Knights provide inexhaustible support of the Church, programs of evangelization and Catholic education, civic involvement, and aid to those in need. Lectors	At each Mass, Lectors orally read specific readings at the ambo at all Masses (Saturdays, Sundays, Holy Days of Obligation, weekdays). Ministers are scheduled for monthly or weekly assignments and must carefully practice and prepare themselves, reading in a deliberate, slow and clear voice so that the words of the page come alive for those listening.
Mens' Holy League	The mission of the Holy League, in a spirit of Marian chivalry, under the patronage of Our Lady of Guadalupe and Saint Joseph: Seeks to provide opportunities for the faithful to unite in prayer, especially monthly Eucharistic holy hours. These opportunities have, as their goal, the purification of sin, in order to give men a predisposition to supernatural grace, that we may be able to more fully exercise the threefold offices of priest, prophet and king received at baptism, in the spirit of fraternity with one another. We meet the First Saturday of every month in the evening in the church to spend time in adoration, praying the rosary and an opportunity to go to confession, followed by spiritual discussion and refreshments in the Parish Center.

Offertory Collection Counting	As good stewards, volunteers are responsible for gathering an counting collections between 9:00AM and 11:30AM Sunday morning. Counting will also be done on Monday beginning at Noon.
Parish Picnic	Each summer in July, our parish holds its annual potluck picnic. Mass is held outdoors at Rivercrest Park, followed by good food & games for old and young. The picnic committee coordinates set-up, take-down, food & games, etc.

Ministry	Description
Parishioners Without Partners (PWOP's)	Parishioners Without Partners (PWOP) was developed as a ministry for single, separated, divorced, or widowed Catholic men and women to meet their needs through service, support, social and spiritual interaction. Go to www.pwop.org for more information.
Pastoral Council	The Parish Pastoral Council seeks to provide consultation to the pastor in formulating and making known the mission of the parish and pastoral ministry. This is accomplished through recommendations regarding: the parish vision for the future; the general directions, priorities, goals and objectives, long and short range plans; and the promotion of communication and understanding within the parish, between parishes and with the diocese and universal church.
Prayer Chain	The St. John the Apostle Church Prayer Chain ministry invites all parishioners and members of our community to pray for the intentions of others. Prayer requests and intentions received by the SJA Prayer Chain ministry are sent to ministry members via email.
Prayer Shawls	This group provides beautiful blankets and shawls that our pastor takes with him when visiting someone who is sick at home or in the hospital. They are made with love and a lot of prayers for the person who will be receiving them.
Prison Ministry	SJA Prison Ministry's mission is to provide hope and compassion to the imprisoned through prayer, correspondence, Pastoral care, and other services in a loving and merciful manner.
Project Start Right	A group of local Churches, including St. John the Apostle, partner with the Oregon Department of Human Services to make sure every child in Clackamas County can start the school year strong. Groups collect supplies for K - 12 students in low-income families or foster care. Donation boxes are in the parish vestibule early in August each year. Religious Education	Religious education of our parish children and youth ensures that the beliefs of our faith are introduced and reinforced as our young people grow, develop and mature as Catholics. Each Wednesday evening during the school year, our parish children, youth and their families are invited to attend a Family Unity Night (F.U.N.) dinner at 5:40PM. This dinner is free and for the entire family even if you are not participating in Religious Education that evening. This is an opportunity for fellowship and fun. The Bible Study Adults and Youth (grades 6 - 12) are excused at 6:10PM. Grades K-5 meet with Beth Link in the Parish Center to do praise and worship, and read the upcoming Sunday Gospel. At 6:30PM, the children are then sent to the appropriate class with a Catechist for the rest of the evening. At 7:50PM, the children, youth, parents and Bible Study adults meet again in the Parish Center for the concluding prayer. K-5th Grade - Preparation for the Sacraments of Reconciliation and First Communion is incorporated into the curriculum. Meetings: Wednesday evenings, during the school year. 6th - 12th Grade (Youth Ministry) - SJA's Youth Ministry offers a variety of social, spiritual and community service activities to foster Catholic value and nurture Christian friendships among the parish youth. This ministry serves our parish youth, 6th - 12th grades. Youth meet for community building, prayer, Church teachings, service, Praise and Worship, and more. Meetings: Wednesday evenings during the school year.
Respect for Life	The goal of the Respect for Life Ministry at St. John the Apostle is to promote and encourage respect for life from conception to natural death through prayer, education, and pro-active support of all life issues. October is Respect Life month and each year we sponsor the "Giving Crib". Baby related items are gathered to assist a local pregnancy resource clinic in helping moms and dads facing unplanned pregnancies. Signatures for potential ballot measures that promote respect for life are also gathered. A supply of trifold brochures is available in the vestibule to educate and inform parishioners on life issues from a Catholic perspective.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)	RCIA is the process for adult non-Catholics to explore the Catholic Church. If you have never been baptized or if you have been baptized in another Christian Church, have been baptized a Catholic but have not received First Communion or Confirmation, have been baptized and have received First Communion but have not been confirmed, or you would like to consider your faith journey in the Catholic Church, you are invited to attend. When: Meets on Tuesday's from 6:30PM - 8:00PM in the Parish Center September through May.
Rosary: A Marian Devtion	The opportunity to pray the Rosary is offered prior to 8:30AM Sunday Mass and immediately following daily 8:00AM Masses (Monday through Friday). Volunteers are needed for leading the Rosary prior to 8:30AM Sunday Mass.
Sacred Music: 10:30 AM	10:30AM Sunday Holy Mass - Children's Choir (1st Sunday) Boys and girls 2nd - 5th grade provide a mix of traditional hymns and contemporary Christian music to support the congregation in song at the 1st Sunday of the month. Rehearse: 1st and 3rd Mondays of the month, 6:00PM - 6:45PM in the church. Choir (2nd, 4th and 5th Sundays) This choir supports the music at the 10:30AM Sunday Masses on the 2nd, 4th, and 5th Sundays of the month. Instrumentalists include guitar, bass, piano, percussion, wind and strings. Vocalists must have the ability or experience in singing harmonies and be able to sight read if possible. Rehearse: Monday evenings at 7:00PM in the Church. Praise and worship Choir (3rd Sunday) Youth and adult instrumentalists and vocalists lead a "praise and worship" style of music on the 3rd Sunday of the month. They provide the energy and musical support for the upbeat and contemplative repertoire of that Mass. Rehearse: 2nd Monday of the month at 7:00PM in the parish center music room.
Sacred Music: 5:30 PM	5:30PM Saturday Holy Mass of Anticipation is supported by a Cantor and a pianist.
Sacred Music: 8:30 AM	8:30AM Sunday Holy Mass - This choir supports the assembly in their sung prayer at the 8:30AM Sunday Mass and offers traditional hymns with vocal support from sopranos, altos, tenors, and baritones accompanied by piano and percussion. Rehearse: Tuesays at 7:00PM.
Sacristans	Sacristans set up the Church, the sanctuary and the altar before every Mass. They remain alert during Mass for something that may need to be addressed.
Serra Club	The Serra Club is a national lay organization whose purpose is to foster and affirm vocations to the ministerial priesthood and vowed religious life, and through this common ministry, further their members' common Catholic faith. Serrans believe that when members gather for prayer, a meal and conversation, they grow in faith and are inspired and challenged by each other. Parish Serra Clubs meet twice a month in addition to scheduling vocation awareness and affirmation activities throughout the year.
Sister Parish Ministry	A primary goal of our sister-parish relationship is to foster a spiritual connection between our communities. Funding from our parishioners previously provided a Formation Center, fuel and bus fare for parish priests and nens and a stipend for emergency parish needs. A committee is currently meeting on Tuesday evenings toward a new sister-parish.
SJA Womens' Group	We are a Catholic Women's group (for all women 18 and up) committed to deepening our relationship with the Lord through prayer, scripture and support as sisters in Christ. Inspired by Mary's "yes" to God's will for our lives. Encouraged by Pope St. John Paul II's apostolic Letter "Mulieris Dignitatem" (On the Dignity and Vocation of Women) and his 1995 Letter to Women, we want to ignite the gifts of "Feminine Genius": respectivity, sensitivity, generosity and spiritual and physical maternity. We desire to grow in faith and friendship with one another. We meet the First Saturday of every month for hot coffee and food for a short study with discussion time followed by adoration, rosary and the opportunity to go to confession.

Ministry	Description
St. John The Apostle Catholic Cemetery	St. John the Apostle Catholic Cemetery exists to honor the spirit of the resurrection, to show respect for the deceased and to provide a resting place for their remains. The Board of Trustees provides advice and support to the cemetery manager to assure continued successful operation of the cemetery. With assistance from the SJA business manager and pastor, the board also engages in fund-raising activities to raise monies for continued cemetery operations. Meetings: 4th Thursday of each month (except December) at 3: 00PM, at the cemetery office building. The Cemetery Board is also seeking volunteers to help with the semi-annual clean-up of the cemetery.
St. Vincent Depaul/Food Bank	The food bank at St. John the Apostle Church serves people in the local community who are in need. This ministry tries to offer a food box that gives clients a well-balanced diet for 3 - 4 days. Produce and bread is available weekly for anyone who is in need. People may receive food once a month. Donations are appreciated and may be placed in the barrel in the vestibule. Periodically, requests for specific items are announced from the pulpit and/or through the parish bulletin. SJA's St. Vincent DePaul Ministry's emergency fund also helps people with rent, utility bills and bus passes. Hours: Thursdays, 4:00PM - 5:00PM
Stewardship/Sacrificial Giving	The central theme of the Bible tells us that we are accountable to God for all the gifts of time, talent and treasure that He entrusts to us for our lifetime. As stewards of God's gifts, we have the responsibility to share those gifts with others. This is particularly true within our parish and the extended family it serves. Sacrificial giving through our offertory gifts helps the parish bring Christ's healing embrace to children, the elderly, the sick and the poor of our community. Opportunities to give include: Weekly envelopes - contact the parish office to order envelopes. Online giving (We Share Program) - You may set up one-time or recurring sacrificial giving to our parish. Donations can be made for Cemetery, SJA School, St. Vincent de Paul, The Welcome Cafe, Holy Days, and flowers for Christmas and Easter, etc. http://sja-catholicchurch.org/ (click on Online Giving)
Stork Club	Stork Club is a ministry intended to ease the burden of an overwhelming time by providing meals. They minister mostly to families who have new babies, but also in other situations where meals would be helpful, such as severe illness. When there is something as life-changing as welcoming new life to the world, this ministry hopes to ease the transition by providing warm, home-cooked meals.
Street Evangelization	We are dedicated to responding to the mandate of Jesus to preach the Gospel to all nations by taking our Catholic Faith to the streets. We do this in a non-confrontational way, allowing the Holy Spirit to move in the hearts of those who witness our public Catholic presence. Christ's call to evangelize was made to every Catholic Christian, and the Second Vatican Council reiterated this need, urging each of the baptized to bring the Gospel, found fully in the Catholic Church, to a culture that has largely reverted to paganism. As an on-the-street Catholic evangelization organization, Street Evangelization provides an avenue for you to share the Person of Jesus Christ and the truth and beauty of the Catholic Faith with a hungry culture.
Sunday Hospitality: Coffee & Donuts	Coffee and donuts are served after 8:30AM and 10:30AM Sunday Masses in our parish center and are served by hospitality ministry members and other ministries.
Teams of Our Lady (TOOL)	Teams of Our Lady calls all Catholic married couples to live a Christ-centered family life, continue to grow closer together in conjugal spirituality and lead Gospel lives. Teams of 5-7 couples each meet together monthly, sharing a simple meal and monthly personal experiences, conducting a time of prayer, and discussing a study topic relating to married, spiritual/faith development.

Ministry	Description
Thanksgiving Day Dinner	The SJA parish community has been organizing, preparing and serving a free community Thanksgiving Day dinner in adition to coordinating with Meals-on-Wheels to serve patrons throughout Clackamas County since 1996. Not only has this annual act of service become a proud part of SJA's holiday tradition, it also embodies our faith and thanksgiving to God. Young and old, rich and poor, those alone for the holiday or not able to prepare a full meal, families, students, retirees, holiday shift-workers and anyone wishing company on this day of thanksgiving are welcome. We invite all to share in the blessing of our table. Further amenities include a children's craft table, a family clothes closet, care packages of basic hygiene and dental supplies, non-perishable food items available to take home, and donated pet care items. Volunteers are needed to prepare meals, greet and serve our guests, and manage ancillary activities, including preparing home-delivered meals for the Meals-on-Wheels program. Thanksgiving Day Dinner: SJA Parish Center, Thanksgiving Day, served 12:00 Noon to 3:00PM. Thanksgiving Meals-on-Wheels: The "Thanksgiving Meals-on-Wheels" is part of the meals for the Thanksgiving Day Dinner at our parish. The coordinator calls the locl senior centers to inform them about our Thanksgiving Meals-on-Wheels dinner. They are invited to participate and to let us know how many meals they would like. The food is prepared at the parish center and the drivers from the senior centers start picking up the food by 10:00AM.
The Welcome Cafe	The Welcome Cafe ministry, begun by our parish in 2015, brings our community together with Christ's love. A hot meal is served in our Parish Center on the 3rd Sunday of each month in a welcoming cafe-style environment. A sack lunch is provided on the 4th Sunday of each month for guests to pick up between 3:00PM - 4:30PM. We serve those in the Oregon City area who are currently experiencing a food shortage or thirsting for company. All volunteers are required to attend a one hour orientation prior to serving.
Ujieres	Los ujieres ayudan a dar la bienvenida a los feligreses e invitados haciendo de la misa una experiencia agradable y beneficiosa para todos los asistentes. Ushers	Assist Greeters in welcoming parishioners and guests and making Mass an enjoyable and beneficial experience for all who attend. Ushers greet and seat people, pass out bulletins and direct Communion. Other responsibilities include managing collections at Masses, straightening up pews after Mass and periodically taking head count. They are familiar with safety equipment and deal with emergencies. Ushers are scheduled for monthly or weekly assignments for the Mass of your choice (Saturdays, Sundays, Holy Days of Obligation).
Vocations Committee	"Prayerfully to build, nurture, and affirm each person's vocation in our parish and in the Catholic Church at large." Parishioners commit themselves to pray at least one day per month for all current vocations in the parish and in the Church. We pray for those vocations already being lived out and for those discerning a call from God. These vocations include married life and widowhood, priesthood, consecrated life, and single life. All these vocations complement one another.
Welcome Committee	This ministry is involved in welcoming all new parishioners and works with Greeters and Ushers to present a welcoming atmosphere to all who attend our Church services. The committee works with the parish office to develop informatioal materials for new parishioners, and with other ministry representatives, is available after Masses to help parishioners sign-up for ministries, faith formation classes, etc.
